Through a partnership with the City of Brantford up to 14 people will receive a housing supplement towards rent in their home/apartment. As of February 2018, 12 of 14 supplements have been approved. This has allowed people the choice and ability to choose a home that meets what they wanted in a home.
				We have assisted approximately 15 people supported in being approved for the Province of Ontario Basic Income project which has created new choices for those people on living choices,
				We have successfully recruited Laurier University students to be LifeShare providers and live with a young woman who experiences autism in her own home. We are currently working with two other students to service as possible providers or roommates.
				We have created an opportunity for one man with complex supports to live in his own apartment within a home with a supportive neighbour upstairs along with staff support.
